



Application for a Salisbury Cathedral Diocese Card

Salisbury Cathedral Diocese Cards are issued to parishioners listed on a Parish Church's Electoral Roll or Cathedral Community Roll, in the Diocese of Salisbury. Each parishioner needs to apply for an individual pass. If you are applying for more than one pass, please provide proof of address for each named individual, including young people living at the same address.

Your pass will be valid for the duration of the electoral roll period and gives free access to the Cathedral and Chapter House during visiting hours.

If you bring guests with you who do not qualify for free entry, they will need to pay the entry charge for visiting.
